Melissa Dunphy is the child of refugees to Australia, and herself immigrated to the USA in 2003. She first came to national attention when her large-scale work the Gonzales Cantata was featured in *The Wall Street Journal*, *The Atlantic*, *National Review*, *Fox News*, and on *The Rachel Maddow Show*. Other notable works include the song cycle *Tesla's Pigeon*, which won first place in the NATS Art Song Composition Award, and choral work *What do you think I fought for at Omaha Beach?* which won the Simon Carrington Chamber Singers Competition and has been performed nationally by ensembles including Chanticleer and Cantus. Dunphy is the recipient of a 2020 Opera America Discovery Grant for *Alice Tierney*, a new opera commission by Oberlin Conservatory. She has been composer-inresidence for the Immaculata Symphony Orchestra, Volti, and the St. Louis Chamber Chorus, and her commissions include works for VOCES8, Mendelssohn Chorus, and the Kennett Symphony. Dunphy is also a Barrymore Award-nominated theater composer and is Director of Music Composition for the O'Neill National Puppetry Conference. Dunphy has a Ph.D. in composition from the University of Pennsylvania and a B.M. from West Chester University and is on faculty at Rutgers University. More at www.melissadunphy.com.

Claudia D. Hernández was born and raised in Guatemala. She's a photographer, poet, Editor, translator, and a bilingual educator residing in Los Angeles. She writes short stories, children's stories, and poetry in Spanish, English, and sometimes weaves in Poqomchi', an indigenous language of her Mayan heritage. Claudia holds an MFA in Creative Writing from Antioch University Los Angeles. Various online literary journals and anthologies throughout the United States, the UK, Canada, Mexico, and Spain have published her work. Hernández is the recipient of the 2018 Louise Meriwether First Book Prize. She is also the Editor of Women, Mujeres, Ixoq: Revolutionary Visions, published by Conocimientos Press in 2017.
